Meanwhile, our Club's new building is moving forward, and we should have footings started later this year. We have also been happy to see that most of the changes we sought from Council have been agreed upon.

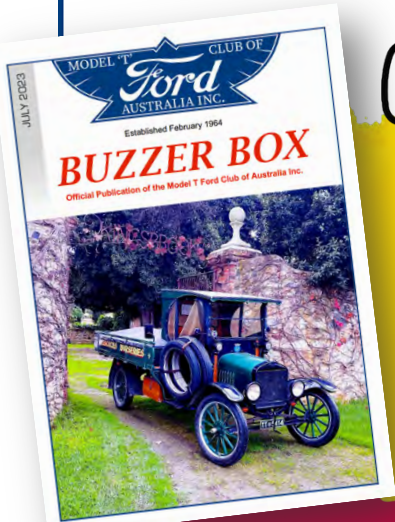

CONDITIONAL REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

By law, your historic, prescribed left hand drive, or street rod vehicle is only conditionally registered if:

1. Your vehicle has current conditional registration through the Government of South Australia, Department for Infrastructure and Transport; and

- For details on obtaining and maintaining conditional registration, please visit <https://www.sa.gov.au/topics/driving-and-transport/registration/conditional-registration/historic-left-hand-drive-and-street-rod-vehicles> or speak to an Authorised Person of a recognised motor vehicle club.

2. You are a financial member of a recognised motor vehicle club (e.g. the Model T Ford Club of Australia Inc.) within the current financial year; and

- The Australian financial year begins on 1 July and ends on 30 June the following year.
- To join or renew membership for the Model T Ford Club of Australia Inc., a *Membership Form* must be completed and returned to the Secretary (contact@modeltfordclubaustralia.org.au).
 - Model T Ford Club of Australia Inc. membership forms, including details of membership fees, can be obtained from <https://www.modeltfordclubaustralia.org.au/club>.

3. Within the current financial year, your Log Book has been endorsed (signed and stamped) by an Authorised Person of the recognised motor vehicle club to which you are a financial member.

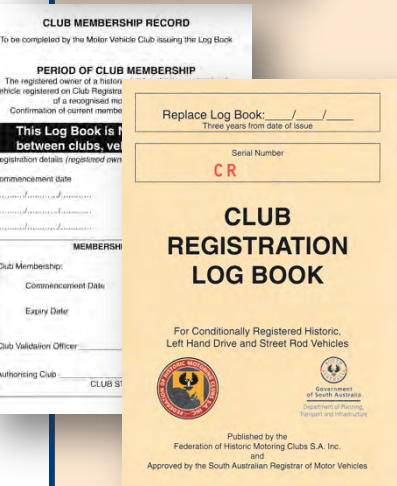
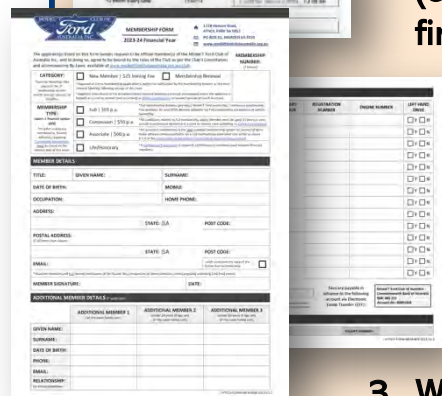
- Before your Log Book can be endorsed (signed and stamped):
 - Your recognised motor vehicle club membership fees must have been paid; and
 - You must produce your *Certificate of Registration* to the Authorised Person.
 - *Owners of prescribed left hand drive vehicles must also produce their *Left Hand Drive Exemption* (issued by the Department for Infrastructure and Transport).
 - **Owners of prescribed street rod vehicles must also produce their *Certificate of Exemption* (issued by the Department for Infrastructure and Transport).
- You must purchase a new Log Book for each vehicle every 3 years at a cost of \$5.00 each.

You are driving an unregistered historic, prescribed left hand drive, or street rod vehicle if:

- Your vehicle does not hold current conditional registration through the Government of South Australia, Department for Infrastructure and Transport; and/or
- You are not a current financial member of a recognised motor vehicle club (e.g. membership fees owing); and/or
- Your Log Book has not been endorsed (signed and stamped) by an Authorised Person of the recognised motor vehicle club for the current financial year; and/or
- You have not completed an entry in your Log Book prior to driving your vehicle.

1. WELCOME:

- 1.1. Meeting commenced at 8:01pm.
- 1.2. The President welcomed everyone.
- 1.3. The President reminded members to either sign the Attendance Record Book or sign-in electronically (for yourself and up to 4 other people) by scanning the QR Code with your smartphone's camera and following the prompts to complete the Google Form.
- 1.4. The President reminded members that audio recording now occurs for all Club meetings.

2. APOLOGIES:

- 2.1. Sarah Bowshall, Adam Jones, Peter & Merawyn Perry, Colin & Julianne Hein, Jim & Glenyss Trenorden, Rod Crawford, Nancy Bennett, and Ken Durward & Sally Nicholas.

3. MYSTERY OBJECTS:

- 3.1. One object from Kingsley Taylor and two objects from Allan Bennett.
- 3.2. One of Allan's was a badge depicting an old Adelaide building with the challenge, tonight, of identifying the building.

4. RAFFLE:

- 4.1. Fundraising Officer, Doretta Hills, initiated a raffle.

5. MINUTES OF LAST GENERAL MEETING, 3RD MAY 2023:

- 5.1. As presented in the June 2023 Buzzer Box.

Moved: David Carver, that the minutes be accepted; Seconded: Kingsley Taylor; Carried.

6. BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES OF THE LAST GENERAL MEETING:

- 6.1. Following up on Paul Van Ruth's comments at item 19.2, the President advised that the System Administrator checked the website and could not locate any reference to the Gilles Plains and Hampstead RSL; The only error found was with the Google Calendar widget that had incorrectly changed the time zone, and this has now been corrected.

7. PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

- 7.1. The President advised that David Dunn, John Clarke, and himself attended Paul (Dusty) Miller's funeral which was held on Tuesday, 30 May 2023 at the Harrison Rivergum Chapel at Ridgehaven; It was a great service and was well attended, by 300 to 400 people, who came to hear how Dusty cared for people in the Defence Services and always thought of others; In lieu of flowers, the family asked that a donation, in Paul's memory, be made to Operation K9 via www.seedifferently.org.au/product/donate-now/.
- 7.2. The President also spoke of John Eastick's 90-year-old mother's, Ann Eastick's, recent passing and her funeral service yesterday at Knightsbridge Baptist Church. Patron Tony and Kip Fuller, Stuart Bowshall, and himself, with Gayl Carver, represented the Club at the service; The President Spoke of Ann's long life, well lived, and how you get to know people more fully at their funeral. In response, John Eastick thanked David for his kind acknowledgement and best wishes, and of his and others attendance.
- 7.3. Adam Jones was admitted for surgery yesterday and the Club wished him all the best in his eight weeks of recovery.

8. SECRETARY'S REPORT:

8.1. In the Secretary's absence, David Dunn reported about general Club matters: For the purposes of General Meeting audio recordings, moving forward, the Committee requests that all members making a report (or similar) at General Meetings please speak from the front of the room, however this is not required if merely asking a question; Reminder notice of the Annual General Meeting on Wednesday, 5 July 2023, following the General Meeting; All elected positions will be declared vacant; Self-nominations for positions are accepted, as well as position nominations on behalf of members (providing prior permission has been sought and received); Please note that honour and award nominations are now closed; The usual club magazines were received and forwarded/provided to Neil Hofmeyer for inclusion in the Library.

8.2. In the Secretary's absence, David Dunn reported about temporary Clubroom Hire matters: The FB-EK Holden Club has confirmed an additional booking on Saturday, 2 July 2023, for its Registration Day; Request for a once-off booking for a birthday party was received and the response was that the hall is only available to long-term/ongoing hirers.

Moved: David Carver, that the Secretary's Report be accepted; Seconded: Brian Teakle;

Carried.

9. NEW MEMBERSHIPS:

9.1. New Associate Membership application received from James Slattery from Paradise, owning a 1997 Mitsubishi Ute; This application was proposed by Paul Van Ruth and seconded by Mik Bojko.

Carried.

10. TREASURER'S REPORT:

10.1. The Treasurer outlined the reconciliation of accounts for the period from 25 April 2023 to 31 May 2023.

Moved: Kingsley Taylor, that the Treasurer's Report be accepted; Seconded: Doretta Hills; Carried.

10.2. The President advised that so far, 70 of the current 138 Primary Members have renewed their membership for the 2023/24 Financial Year; A reminder, therefore, to the balance of members, to please renew their membership with completed forms to the Secretary and Membership Fees paid to the Club's bank account.

11. PROJECT MANAGER'S REPORT:

11.1. John Eastick updated members on progress since the last General Meeting: CROYDON: Council has implemented building design changes to reflect the Club's comments, being that the internal wall space in the Meeting Room has been increased, the double door to the Store has been changed to a single door, the window wall has been decreased from three panels to one panel on each side of the double door, the solar array is shown on the longer roof, a rubbish bin enclosure has been included, the perimeter gates remain in the same location after a Council investigation, the front area will be grassed and both the building and site levels are subject to final design; Detailed design is currently around 60% complete; A development application has been submitted through the PlanSA portal and a planning approval has already been received; The public Expression of Interest (Eoi) from Builders has closed and the Tender Assessment Panel is currently assessing submissions; COUNCIL PROCESS: Council has confirmed that the offer of a new Croydon 5 + 5 year lease will not be subject to a further round of community consultation; The Club continues to liaise on an as needs basis with Ward Councillors; FAWK RESERVE HALL: Nil to report; GRANTS: Neither the Club nor the Council have received any communication from the Department of Infrastructure and Transport (DIT) in relation to the State Government's *SA Car Clubs Program (SACCP)* application.

11.2. In the Secretary's absence, John Eastick advised that separate emails were forwarded to all Hiring Clubs of Fawk Reserve Hall and our own Club Members to officially advise them of the federal funding that has been awarded towards the new clubroom construction.

12. CLUBROOMS MAINTENANCE COORDINATOR REPORT:

12.1. Stuart Bowshall reported: The roller shutter is not yet fixed, and John Eastick is continuing to liaise with Council regarding this matter; New sensors in the toilets have been fitted by Council, with its electrician removing the manual on/off switches and indicating that sensor controlled lights and fans should now remain on for 30 minutes; David Dunn, Neil Hofmeyer, and Stuart Bowshall have installed the 2 X Radiant Strip Wall Mounted Heaters and switches for the heaters are located at the rear of

the hall, near the switches for the air conditioning units. Stuart thanked David and Neil for their efforts; Any findings of sharps (eg. syringes, needles, etc.) are continuing to be reported to the City of Charles Sturt's triage service (including after hours) on (08) 8408 1111, noting that four sharps were discovered at the Registration Day under the northern side door; Residual Current Devices (RCDs) and Emergency Exit Lights are to be tested during the next month.

12.2. Bob Yates indicated that there was nothing to report about cleaning.

13. BUZZER BOX REPORT:

13.1. The President reported: The Editor position remains vacant at this time; The Committee is hopeful that someone will step up to become the Editor and to not feel as though they necessarily need to meet expectations of the current standard; An interim Buzzer Box with lesser content is continuing to be produced and will revert back to monthly publications as bi-monthly publications were deemed unsuitable for the purposes of including the President's Report, General Meeting Minutes, and other required content, and may also have been too lengthy for posting at the normal postage rate; Monthly Buzzer Box nights will therefore also resume.

14. FEDERATION REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT:

14.1. The President reminded members of the call for a Proxy Federation Representative for occasions when Paul Van Ruth is unable to attend Federation General Meetings; The next Meeting is scheduled for Saturday, 17 June 2023 at 2pm; The Annual General Meeting (AGM) is scheduled for Saturday, 19 August 2023 at 2pm.

14.2. Paul Van Ruth reported: The Motorfest is currently being planned and the schedule has been placed on the noticeboard in the Foyer.

14.3. Conditional Registration after a member passes away: Neil Murrie questioned what he considered to be a significant shift in approach and suggested that the last Club General Meeting minutes were ambiguous and needed to be revised. Paul Van Ruth responded by reading from the recent Federation Meeting Minutes and confirmed that the Club minutes were consistent and therefore correct. As an Authorised Person, David Dunn spoke of the apparent misunderstanding by certain persons that the Registrar or SA Motor Vehicle's registration is upheld upon death. Rather, Club financial rules apply in such circumstances and in our Club's case, membership continues until the following 30 June.

15.1. Adam Jones spoke about the Club organised Past and Future Events.

Registration Day and BBQ at Fawk Reserve Hall on Sunday, 28 May 2023: Overall, the day went well, but there were seemingly less attendees than previous years; As Kingsley and Jenny Taylor were unable to attend due to sickness, David Dunn and Sarah Bowshall filled in as Acting Treasurers for the purpose of membership renewals; 44 Log Books were dealt with; The President thanked those that assisted on the day.
