

CONDITIONAL REGISTRATION **QUIREMENTS**

By law, your historic, prescribed left hand drive, or street rod vehicle is only conditionally registered if:


- 1. Your vehicle has current conditional registration through the Government of South Australia, Department for Infrastructure and Transport; and
 - · For details on obtaining and maintaining conditional registration, please visit https://www.sa.gov.au/topics/driving-and-transport/registration/conditionalregistration/historic-left-hand-drive-and-street-rod-vehicles or speak to an Authorised Person of a recognised motor vehicle club.
- 2. You are a financial member of a recognised motor vehicle club (e.g. the Model T Ford Club of Australia Inc.) within the current financial year; and
 - The Australian financial year begins on 1 July and ends on 30 June the following
 - To join or renew membership for the Model T Ford Club of Australia Inc., a Membership Form must be completed and returned to the Secretary (contact@modeltfordclubaustralia.org.au).
 - Model T Ford Club of Australia Inc. membership forms, including details of membership fees, can be obtained from https://www.modeltfordclubaustralia.org.au/club.
- 3. Within the current financial year, your Log Book has been endorsed (signed and stamped) by an Authorised Person of the recognised motor vehicle club to which you are a financial member.
 - Before your Log Book can be endorsed (signed and stamped):
 - o Your recognised motor vehicle club membership fees must have been paid; and
 - O You must produce your *Certificate of Registration* to the Authorised Person. *Owners of prescribed left hand drive vehicles must also produce their *Left* Hand Drive Exemption (issued by the Department for Infrastructure and Transport).
 - **Owners of prescribed street rod vehicles must also produce their Certificate of Exemption (issued by the Department for Infrastructure and Transport).
 - You must purchase a new Log Book for each vehicle every 3 years at a cost of \$5.00 each.

- You have not completed an entry in your Log Book prior to driving your vehicle.

1. WELCOME:

- 1.1. Meeting commenced at 8:00pm.
- 1.2. The President welcomed everyone.
- 1.3. The Secretary requested that members please remember to sign the Attendance Record Book; Alternatively, members can now sign-in electronically (for themselves and up to 4 other people) by scanning the QR Code with their smartphone's camera and following the prompts to complete the Google Form; Signs for the Electronic Attendance Record are posted around the clubrooms.

2. APOLOGIES:

2.1. Peter & Merawyn Perry, Paul Van Ruth, Rod Crawford, Michael Trenorden, Nancy Bennett, Ron Willis, and Ken Durward & Sally Nicholas.

3. MYSTERY OBJECTS:

3.1. Four objects; Three from Tony Russell and one from Allan Bennett.

4. RAFFLE:

4.1. Fundraising Officer, Doretta Hills, initiated a raffle.

5. MINUTES OF LAST GENERAL MEETING, 1ST MARCH 2023:

5.1. As presented in the April 2023 Buzzer Box.

Moved: David Carver, that the minutes be accepted; Seconded: Neil Hofmeyer; Carried.

6. BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES OF THE LAST GENERAL MEETING:

6.1. Nil.

7. PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

7.1. Several MTFCA members attended Laurie Leonard's (Life Member) funeral at the Enfield Memorial Park in the Acacia Reflection Room Chapel on 8 March 2023; Daughter, Noela, was extremely grateful for the attendance of Club members.

Moved: David Carver, that the President's Report be accepted; Seconded: David Dunn; Carried.

8. SECRETARY'S REPORT:

- 8.1. The Secretary reported about general Club matters: Email received from the Model A Ford Club indicating that photos from the Model A Breakfast Run on Sunday, 19 February 2023 can be accessed via: https://photos.app.goo.gl/CGao2vnrbfFhb4XG6; Paul Van Ruth has provided some book donations to the Library; The usual club magazines were received and forwarded/provided to Neil Hofmeyer for inclusion in the Library.
- 8.2. The Secretary reported about temporary Clubroom Hire matters: Neil Hofmeyer booked an additional booking on Thursday, 16 March 2023; An email was sent to all Hiring Clubs on 22 March 2023 asking them to stack chairs (to a maximum of 5 chairs high) along the curtain wall before vacating the hall; It was noted that the stacking of chairs is for the benefit of our Cleaner, but that it also makes it easier for Hirers to ensure the carpet is vacuumed prior to leaving.

Moved: Sarah Bowshall, that the Secretary's Report be accepted; Seconded: Tony Russell; Carried.

9. NEW MEMBERSHIP:

9.1. New Individual Membership Application received from Brenton Oates of Redwood Park, owning a 1923 Model T Ute and a 1998 Ford XH Series II Ute; This application was proposed by Ian Oates and seconded by Sarah Bowshall.

9.2. New Family Membership Application received from Janne Anderson and partner, Anthony Schaedel, from Olary (rural location); Janne has purchased Karen Bagshaw's 1927 Model T Ford; Membership initiated through the Club's Facebook page; This application was proposed by Sarah Bowshall and seconded by David Dunn.

Moved: Sarah Bowshall, that these two memberships be accepted; Seconded: David Dunn; Carried.

10. TREASURER'S REPORT:

- 10.1. The Treasurer outlined the reconciliation of accounts for the month of March 2023.
- 10.2. Against an approved budget of \$4,000, material costs to-date for the hall are \$3,250; The installation of heating is currently being planned and will be an additional cost.

Moved: Kingsley Taylor, that the March 2023 Treasurer's Report be accepted; Seconded: Mik Bojko; Carried.

11. PROJECT MANAGER'S REPORT:

- 11.1. John Eastick updated members on progress since the last meeting on 1 March 2023: John had been away for close to three weeks in March 2023, with matters continuing to progress during this time; CROYDON: The Stallard Meek Flightpath Architects (SMFA) team had prepared documents which were provided to Council staff for their review; A soil test was undertaken on the site; Cost check underway to validate the design; An opportunity for the Club's review of the Architectural and Engineering plans is imminent; COUNCIL PROCESS: After clarification, Council staff confirmed yesterday that a \$1m Federal Government Local Roads and Community Infrastructure (LRCI) Grant had been allocated to the Model T Ford Club New Clubroom Construction project; This is subject to Council process and cannot be fully confirmed until the end of June 2023; Have no doubt, this is a very significant positive step forward; The Model T Ford Club New Clubroom Construction project is embedded in the 2023/24 Budget process and that process moves to the step of Community Consultation commencing on Wednesday, 12 April 2023, with a closure date of Saturday 6 May; Members are asked to please provide submissions of support as part of this Community Consultation process; Submitted an Expression of Interest for a Federal Government Stronger Communities (Programme Round 8) Grant of \$20,000 and awaiting an invitation to prepare and submit an application; Invited to submit an application for the State Government's SA Car Club Program (SACCP) Grant under the Infrastructure Stream and Sarah is leading the preparation of the application in conjunction with Council; Tony Williams is networking with Councillors and a meeting with Woodville Ward Councillors was held on 31 March 2023; Tony is trying to finalise a meeting date with Hindmarsh and Beverley Ward Councillors in April 2023; FAWK RESERVE HALL: The sensors in the three toilets are faulty and Council is investigating; The Committee continues to investigate a number of energy saving options to reduce operational costs; There has been early thinking about a solution for the Meeting Room heating; A liaison meeting with the West Croydon Football Club is planned.
- 11.2.In reference to the sensors in the toilets, Maintenance Coordinator, Stuart Bowshall, advised that he had bypassed the sensors, consistent with earlier advice of Council's electrician, as the lights were turning off too soon and this was deemed an immediate OH&S risk; John advised that he needs to keep Council informed as Council are directly involved in this matter.
- 11.3. The Secretary advised that, as per Council's *Sporting and Community Club Fees Policy* on Building Rental, clause 2.3 states that *'For the purpose of calculating rent, any State or Federal funding received by Clubs for capital improvements will be shown as equity for the Club <u>not</u> Council'.*
- 11.4.David Dunn addressed the members and spoke about what has occurred in the Club's history prior to being temporarily accommodated at Fawk Reserve Hall; This included mention of the previous clubrooms, namely, Baulderstone Hall, Main Street at Eastwood, Conyingham Street at Frewville, and Port Road at Croydon; Our accommodation at Port Road was a consequence of negotiations between Mik Bojko and Council's Tony Williams in 1996; David expressed thanks to Tony Williams, Sarah Bowshall, Kingsley Taylor, and John Eastick, for their contributions to the Club, particularly in relation to the Club's accommodation; In turn, the President thanked David Dunn for his support and contributions; Brian Teakle mentioned the large extent of work undertaken when looking at accommodation options before finally settling at Port Road.

12. CLUBROOMS MAINTENANCE COORDINATOR REPORT:

12.1. Stuart Bowshall reported: David Dunn has fixed the drain grate in the urinal; The sensors controlling

the lights and fans in the toilets are faulty and have been temporarily bypassed, thereby requiring manual operation; John Eastick indicated that he was awaiting a Council response to the problem with the sensor lights; There is some graffiti present on the front of the building and Council has been notified so that it may be removed; John Eastick is still awaiting a response from Council regarding the hall's rear roller shutter, which is not currently operational; Any findings of sharps (eg. syringes, needles, etc.) are continuing to be reported to the City of Charles Sturt's triage service (including after hours) on (08) 8408 1111.

- 12.2. The Secretary advised that a Maintenance Workgroup consisting of David Dunn, David Carver, Neil Hofmeyer, and Albert Jones has been established so that Stuart has a pool of volunteers that he can draw from to assist with various and ongoing Maintenance issues; Others are welcome to put their hand up for inclusion in the pool.
- 12.3.Bob Yates reported that some Hirers are still not cleaning the floors properly after their meetings. The Secretary indicated that Hiring Clubs have already been reminded, via email, to ensure the carpet is vacuumed prior to leaving.
- 12.4.Bob Yates reported that some Hirers stack chairs in front of the northern fire exit door, and this must stop immediately. The Secretary indicated that Hiring Clubs have already been asked, via email, to stack chairs along the curtain wall.

13. BUZZER BOX REPORT:

13.1.As both the Secretary and the person producing the current format of the Buzzer Box, Sarah advised the following: Buzzer Box Editor position remains vacant following the Annual General Meeting and is continuing to be advertised in the Buzzer Box; The Buzzer Box publication will now be produced bimonthly with minimal content; On this basis, there will be no May 2023 edition of the Buzzer Box and therefore no Buzzer Box night in April 2023.

14. FEDERATION REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT:

14.1.In Paul Van Ruth's absence, the Secretary reported: Meeting Minutes dated 11 February 2023 have been received and filed; Call for a Proxy Federation Representative for occasions when Paul is unable to attend the Federation General Meeting, with meetings taking place every second month on Saturdays at 2pm at the Combined Car Clubs (CCC) Building at the Glandore Community Centre; Next Meeting scheduled for Saturday, 15 April 2023 at 2pm.

11. PROJECT MANAGER'S REPORT:

- 11.1. John Eastick updated members on progress since the last General Meeting; April 2023 was a busy month of activity, much of a strategic nature, which included attaining more key information about the replacement building project; HEADLINE: The great hot news is that a Federal grant of \$1 million has been secured for the replacement building project and as we understand it, all steps are in place and indicators are there for the project to proceed without any other immediate budgetary approvals; This news was applauded by the members present; Council documentation received included the following three written statements: 'A budget of \$950,000.00 has been secured to fund the construction of the new Model T Ford facility.'; 'The previous building was one of the most extensively used of all the assets controlled by the City of Charles Sturt, therefore approval was granted to build a new fit for purpose facility, where car enthusiasts can meet as well as the opportunity for utilisation by other community groups to.'; 'A new fit for purpose Clubroom where car enthusiasts can meet. The previous building was utilised by more than 15 different car clubs, it will provide ongoing support to our community.'; CROYDON: Using the audio-visual equipment, a detailed visual presentation of the concept plans received was presented to members by John, with Sarah's assistance; Discussion ensued about a number of design elements and a number of questions arose from members and were addressed appropriately at this time; The Stallard Meek Flightpath Architects (SMFA) concept plans were received from Council on 26 April 2023 ahead of the April Committee Meeting; The Committee reviewed the plans and consolidated review comments were forwarded to Council on Monday, 1 May 2023; There is a follow up conversation planned for tomorrow at 11am to then enable Council to instruct SMFA to move on to seek development approval through the PlanSA portal; The Project will be advertised for public Expression of Interest from Builders imminently, followed by a selective tender process; Representing the Club, John is on Council's Tender Evaluation Panel; Whilst ambitious, an indicative program received from Council suggests an August 2023 commencement and a February/March 2024 completion; COUNCIL PROCESS: Council staff have re-affirmed that a \$1 million Federal Government Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Grant has been allocated to the Model T Ford Club New Clubroom Construction project; Therefore, there is no requirement for community consultation as a part of the 2023/24 Business Plan's approval process; Tony Williams has continued to network with Councillors and a meeting with the Hindmarsh and Beverley Ward Councillors was held earlier this evening; Following an earlier meeting with the Woodville Ward Councillors, the purpose of these meetings with Councillors has been to bolster ongoing support for the project; FAWK RESERVE HALL: Here at Fawk Reserve Hall, a lease extension will be required for probably 6 months (1 January to 30 June 2023) with the Hold Over clause in the current Lease allowing this to easily occur on a monthly basis; GRANTS: Submitted an Expression of Interest for a Federal Government Stronger Communities (Programme Round 8) Grant of \$20,000 and received advice that it was unsuccessful as it did not meet the selection criteria; Lead by Sarah, and with outstanding support from Council staff, the Club prepared and submitted an application for the State Government's SA Car Club Program (SACCP) Grant under the Infrastructure stream. The application was, in its effect, for the cost of supplying and installing a solar storage battery valued at approximately \$60,000, which forms an integral part of the building project.
- 11.2. The Secretary advised that she would provide a key messages update to Hiring Clubs and our own members via email.
